CONTENT

This programme is designed to provide the underpinning knowledge, and practical skills, required for a wide variety of technician posts within the general area of electronic and computer technology, or to permit articulation to degree courses in these areas. Core subjects covered include: Information Technology; Communications; Quality Principles and Practice; Engineering Project (2). Principles / Technology topics from Electronics covered include: Electronic Devices; Power Electronics; Logic; Power Supply Circuits. Principles / Technology topics from Computer Technology covered include: Computer Operating Environments; Hardware Installation and Maintenance (2); Engineering Programme (HII); Data Communications; Microcontrollers. Other topics may include: Application of PLC's; Digital Systems Testing; Optical Fibre Principles; Mathematics for Engineering; Multimedia Systems; Network Technology; Robotics. A total of 12 credits are required to obtain the HNC award.

The required level of academic qualification for the function of the architectural technician so defined is an HNC with appropriate experiential learning or a full-time HND followed by structured and evidenced experiential learning. The mechanism for verifying the experiential learning is the Professional and Occupational Performance Record required as part of the process of attaining Technician membership of the British Institute of Architectural Technologists (TBIAT). The Architectural Technician function includes "the preparation, coordination and communication of technical information including drawings, graphical information, reports and schedules, contributing to meeting relevant statutory regulations and controlling projects by monitoring agreed quality standards and obtaining, recording and organising information."

FUTURE PROSPECTS

Architectural Technicians are employed in private practise and work with Architects, Surveyors, Interior Designers and Architectural Technologists. They can also be employed by specialist design/build contractors, local authorities and larger organisations to provide in-house design/drafting services. The proposed HNC and HND in Architectural Technology has been designed to meet the functions defined above and also to allow progression to appropriate degree courses in Architectural Technology.

This should increase the attractiveness and availability of the proposed qualifications. The foundation course, the HNC Construction Engineering, is the main stepping stone for learners

entering the full-time courses with Highers, or transferring from other disciplines and represents 12 of the 15 units of the first year of the HND Civil Engineering. Important relevant core skills such as Construction Communication Skills, Construction Site Surveying, and 2D CAD for Construction reflect the industry move to E-technology. Thus the HNC Construction Engineering presents an opportunity for a variety of entrants and allow students to be certified for one year of full-time study. Learners following the traditional part-time route, with underpinning knowledge gained from NQ type programmes, and skills gained in relevant employment, may be granted Accreditation of Prior Experiential Learning (APEL) from some of the units of the HNC Construction and would proceed directly to the HNC Civil Engineering or the HNC Structural Engineering. Both these qualifications would advance learning in areas such as site surveying. The Civil Engineering qualification would contain specialist areas such as water, roads and railways. The Structural Engineering qualification provides the opportunity for those students from design offices requiring further structural design units. Both qualifications would contain a common core of units and consequently, the two specialist areas together with areas common with the Built Environment awards in Construction Management, Architectural Technology, Quantity Surveying and Building Surveying, would encourage common delivery and teamwork with a range of specialist areas.

FUTURE PROSPECTS

Finally, the new structure of awards presents opportunities for candidates on a part-time programme to obtain an HND. For example, on the basis of a candidate awarded 6 units APEL from the HNC Construction Engineering, and gaining the 12 unit HNC Civil Engineering or HNC Structural Engineering, required a further 12 units from the HND Construction Engineering (HND Year 1) who may be successful in obtaining employment, and could then elect to do HND Civil Engineering on a part-time basis. It is also envisaged that some units might be delivered and assessed on a flexible and distance learning basis.
